The Snyders, a Chicago-style blues band from

Montreal, are providing the entertainment along with Delilah DeWylde and the Lost Boys, a West Michigan Rockabilly trio. Tickets are \$25 per person or \$45 a couple. The evening's entertainment includes the music, snacks, desserts and a midnight buffet topped off with a champagne toast. There will be a cash bar to raise funds for Two Rivers Coalition.

The Snyders play blues, rock and pop. It's a family show with Danny Snyder on lead guitar, his son Phillip on drums and daughter Lorie on electric bass. They sing in English and French. Lorie sings on Snyder's eighth album, which won the 2010 Blues Album of the Year in Quebec. Danny's wife
